Surely you courageous millions will carry on, fearing not hell itself in the struggle for a place among men and for the freedom of our country, Africa.

### Enemies Still at Work to Discourage You

Our enemies are trying to discourage you, and now that I am imprisoned they are endeavoring to use disloyal presidents and officers to disobey the orders of the Parent Body at New York and build up little organizations of their own by which they locally could exploit the people. Fellow members of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and fellow Negroes, watch carefully and guard your organization against local self-seeking presidents or officers. Remember the purpose for which you have been organized. It was not for supporting selfish men at your expense and to your loss, but for our coming together as one great body to do together what we could not do separately.

### Parent Body Like Federal Government

The Parent Body of the Universal Negro Improvement Association is like the great Federal Government of the United States or like the great Imperial Government of Great Britain. All the States are subordinate to the Federal Government and all the Dominions are subordinate and loyal to the home government in England; so also must the divisions of the Universal Negro Improvement Association all over the world be subordinate and loyal to the Parent Body at New York. Therefore, any president or officer, whether he be in New York, Panama or Santo Domingo, who feels like making a little local personal business for himself out of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, there is but one thing for the membership to do, and that is to ask him to take his exit.

### Look Out for Disloyal Leaders

Look out for disloyal leaders at this time. Keep your eyes open and make no mistake in putting them out of the association as fast as they show their heads. We can only win out when all of us stand together. Let no one fool you into believing that divided we can win. It is impossible. We must be united and together.

Remember, men and women, that I took thirteen men and women and in seven years built up a world-wide organization of millions. Don't let the selfish devils tear you asunder and destroy our work of race unity and uplift. Keep up the work for just a few more years and God is sure to crown our efforts with success.

Please support the Parent Body through the newly elected officers. I ask and beseech of all members, branches, chapters and divisions to be loyal and dutiful in obeying the commands of the new administration, which I will advise and assist in any way I can until I return to you.

Let us all pull together as we have always done, and don't allow the devil and our enemies to come between. We must all make one big pull and all together, and let us do this with clear minds and pure hearts. Don't mind what the enemy says. That cannot hurt you. It is what you do and say that hurts.

# GREAT CONVENTION CLOSES AFTER BLENDED SESSIONS

## NEWLY ELECTED OFFICERS INDUCTED AT ENTHUSIASTIC MASS MEETING AT TURNER'S HALL—OATH IS ADMINISTERED BY REV. J. D. BARBOUR

### GEORGE O. MARKE, SUPREME DEPUTY, FAILS TO APPEAR TO ANSWER CHARGES AFTER PROMISING TO DO SO AND IS DISMISSED FOR CAUSE

### Convention Refuses to Entertain Sherrill's Plea for Leniency and Refers Him to Hon. Marcus Garvey—Leaves Detroit Without Hearing in Resignation, but Stating "Willingness to Serve"

#### SUNDAY AFTERNOON SESSION, MARCH 21

At the afternoon meeting at Turner's Hall the oath of office was administered by the Rev. Barbour to the following duly elected officers of the association:

- Fred A. Toole, First Assistant President General.
- Jay J. Peters, Third Assistant President General.
- William A. Wallace, Secretary General.
- Mr. F. Levi Lord, Chancellor.
- Mr. J. J. Burrows, Assistant Secretary General.

Each duly elected officer gave an undertaking of good faith and willingness to live up to the oath taken and to carry out the wishes and instructions of the founder and administrator of the organization, the Hon. Marcus Garvey, and to work for the redemption of the motherland, Africa.

The chairman then conducted the members of the President's Committee for valuable services rendered.

Mr. Handley (Boston) presented a resolution that the deputies and delegates assembled go on record as expressing their gratitude to the Hon. Marcus Garvey for his leadership and for the inspiration of our life.

The Hon. Garvey (Kentucky) then presented his recommendations which were accepted by the Executive Council with the following resolutions:

1. Parent Body take more interest in affairs of local divisions.
2. Parent Body audit books of local divisions.
3. Parent Body keep local divisions up to date in the progress of the association.
4. Parent Body extend operations to all parts of the United States and other territories, for which purpose resolutions be made in three or four foreign languages.
5. Parent Body extend courtesies and thanks to bondholders of the Black Cross and Construction Loan.
6. Parent Body (Detroit) make recommendation of a moderate salary scale for the newly elected officers.

#### MONDAY MORNING SESSION, MARCH 22

The meeting was opened at 10 a. m. with the usual roll call. The minutes of the previous meeting were then read and confirmed.

The following telegram was read from the president general: "Thanks for riding the Association's train and for protecting my wife."

Mr. Peters suggested that reply be sent to the president general. Mr. Sherrill being introduced, Mr. Burrows (N. Y.) moved that the matter be laid on the table. Mr. Burrows (N. Y.) seconded. The motion unanimously carried.

Regarding Mr. Sherrill's report, Mr. Johnson (Detroit) made a motion that the convention inform Mr. Sherrill that it is the sense of this convention that he should take up with Mr. Garvey personally the matter of conversion of any charges which have been brought against him. Mr. Faison (Ill.) seconded. The matter was put to the house, and unanimously carried.

Recommendations and Resolutions Presented for Future Consideration by the New Administration

Mr. McHurt (Chicago) presented a resolution calling for written credentials of all and all visitors to divisions.

Mr. S. A. Haynes (Pittsburgh) then presented the following resolution, which was unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the U. N. I. A. and A. C. L. has been seriously embarrassed because of legal action brought by executive officers for salaries.

And, whereas, dismissed officials have in the past exerted their influence to the detriment of the association, and whereas, the conduct of such officials, members of the proudest race on earth, is tantamount to treason where African nationalism is concerned.

It is resolved, that they be debarred from holding membership in the U. N. I. A. and A. C. L. for not less than 75 years, and executive office not less than 100 years.

## HONORABLE MARCUS GARVEY TAKES EXCEPTION TO BALD STATEMENTS IN AUDITOR-GENERAL'S REPORT

### RUSHED TO PRISON SHORTLY AFTER SHIP SAILED, HE WAS NOT ASKED BY TREASURER OR AUDITOR TO THROW LIGHT ON TRANSACTIONS CONCERNED

### MR. F. LEVI LORD, AUDITOR, IN STATEMENT EXPLAINS THERE WERE NO FINANCIAL IRREGULARITIES

### All at Headquarters Understood Herculean Efforts of President to Clear Ship and Unusual Circumstances That Attended Same

In the report of cash audit of the first voyage of the S. S. General W. Goethals, as read by the ex-Auditor-General, Hon. F. Levi Lord, at the recent Detroit Convention and reproduced in the last issue of The Negro World, references were made to "discrepancies" and "differences in doubt" in connection with certain payments entered as "interficial disbursements." A total sum of \$350 was shown as a "difference in doubt," the Auditor-General in his report stating that "discrepancies cannot be verified because there was no interchange of receipts."

As the officer referred to in connection with the above-mentioned transaction, the Hon. Marcus Garvey, feeling that an erroneous impression might be created in the minds of the public, wrote his Executive Secretary the following letter:

LETTER FROM MR. GARVEY  
Mr. Norton G. Thomas,  
56 West 125th Street,  
New York City.

I have observed my name mentioned in report of Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company which was a peculiar one, known to every one in the office. The New York office advanced fifty dollars through my secretary on the trip to cover expenses of the ship to finally clear her from America, which I had to do without any assistance from New York other than the fifty dollars. Port charges, wharfage, coal and other expenses had to be cleared on Saturday before noon. Repairs, supplies, clearance and other important business arrangements had to be looked after in a half day before banks and business houses and customs were closed.

There is every reason to suppose that the report which the Virgin Islands passed from Denmark to the United States intended to make the inhabitants of the islands believe that unless they took specific steps to the contrary, but the presence of my name in the report is a reflection on me, the treaty was signed upon my name to democratic administration at the time the Captain was in the island.

### Presidents' Committee, Faithful to Last, Make Futile Journey to New York in Hope of Last-Minute Salvation

The S. S. General G. W. Goethals was sold at public auction by U. S. Marshal on Monday, March 29, at pier 75, foot of 35th street, New York City, by virtue of a writ of venditioni exponas for \$25,000. The immediate cause of sale was libels by shippers for non-performance of contract in regard to freight which was to have been shipped to Miami. A Mr. Waite, of New York City, bought the ship. He had lent the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company \$10,000, an amount which was still owing, and besides, had made an outlay of about \$5,000 in connection with the chartering of the vessel last September.

As the ship was lost to Negroes on the stroke of the auctioneer's hammer, Messrs. Sherrill, Bourne and Carter, officers of the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company, exchanged sheepish glances with each other. They had been in New York for some time, and were there for the purpose of being forcibly by the people. What thoughts were theirs as they beheld the tragic climax to their mismanagement, God alone can tell. Members of the administration were also in attendance.

The "Goethals" was chartered by Mr. B. L. Stafford, Jr., last September. The charter was cancelled by the Black Cross because of the charterer's inability to meet certain stipulated payments.

Crawford, agent of the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company, acting for the Oversea Navigation and Trading Company, of which he is president, becomes the new charterer. His article on the mishandling of the affairs of the "Goethals" is published merely to throw some light on the distressing climax to a year of mismanagement on the part of the officers who conducted the affairs of the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company in the absence and without the co-operation and counsel of the Hon. ## SEEKING TO STEER THE ADVANCE OF AFRICA AWAKE

### Engishmen in West Africa Slept, Lulled to Sleep by Superiority Myth; Now They Frantically Seek to "Correct Mentality"

### From the Gold Coast Times

The history of the relations between the white race and the natives in West Africa is like the fable of the hare and the tortoise. At the beginning of the associations of the natives with the British the latter did not seem to have any special advantage over the natives. The natives were not such as would permit them to settle in the country and make themselves lords of the land. They were too busy to give the natives such an inferior knowledge as would make them useful as clerks, timers and overseers, and thus be made to relieve white men of much hard work in a trying climate. And as they started on their education and, like the hare in the fable, went to sleep, much satisfaction was felt by the tortoise. They slept and though now and then black men were produced whose mental capacity was far above the average of their people, they were not regarded as such by the white men. They were regarded as prodigies, and continued to sleep on to the day of their death. But they awoke from their long sleep some eight years ago, just about the termination of the war. To discover, in spite of his handicaps, the black man has made considerable progress and means to maintain the result of his discovery has caused the white man mental agitation. On the Gold Coast the white man's capacity for the people of the continent has been demonstrated. Here he is establishing a foundry for the moulding of the natives into a people of the future. With the possible exception of the natives coming out in platoons even before they can find their students and a place to go to school, the white man has been rushing through the local Legislature to circumscribe the intellectual advance of the people of the continent. The matter is that Englishmen have found out that if the black man is permitted to advance, he will be a danger to the white man.
