Your attitude at Detroit in the fortnight just ended has proven that the members of the Universal Negro Improvement Association have as much foresight and determination as the men and women of other races when fighting for a righteous cause.

If I were to feel that any member of the Universal Negro Improvement Association or real member of my race had lost hope and given up because of my imprisonment and suffering, then I would weep for the failure of my effort to convince men that there is no easy road to victory and that if the serf must be free he himself must fight for his liberty.

Surely my teachings of years shall not fail among the millions of black men and women who have heard me. Surely you courageous millions will carry on, fearing not hell itself in the struggle for a place among men and for the freedom of our country, Africa.

# Enemies Still at Work to Discourage You

Our enemies are trying to discourage you, and now that I am imprisoned they are endeavoring to use disloyal presidents and officers to disobey the orders of the Parent Body at New York and build up little organizations of their own by which they locally could exploit the people. Fellow members of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and fellow Negroes, watch carefully and guard your organization against local self-seeking presidents or officers. Remember the purpose for which you have been organized. It was not for supporting selfish men at your expense and to your loss, but for our coming together as one great body to do together what we could not do separately.

I kept no accounts, My secretaries did, as the treasurer and auditor we very one in the office. The New York office advanced fifty dollars through my secretary on the trip to cover expenses of the ship to finally clear he other than the fifty dollars. Port charges, wharfage, coal and extra supplies for the round trip of thirty-one days, advance crew wages, employees wages, etc., had to be met by me between Philadelphia and Norfolk. There was a terrible accident to ship in Philadelphia that called for repairs of had to be cleared on a Saturday before noon. Repairs, supplies, clearance and other important business arrangements had to be looked after in a nalf day before banks and business houses and customs were closed. In the rush to enable Balfour Williams, the purser of the boat, to go around with the Captain and have all other clearances arranged, I had pe sonally to look after the supplies that were needed and which were not fully supplied in New York as per request of the Steward. Monies were supplies. In that respect I ordered my Secretary to pay to Williams the amount charged against him as Purser of the boat. There was no time

to reach Williams in that the office was about three miles away from the ship. I took the money from the Secretary for Williams, run ed to the ship.
Williams was ashore attending to other matters; time was going. It was impossible for Williams or any one person to get through all the requirements on that Saturday afternoon. I rushed from ship to chandlers and suppliers, paid for supplies, etc., out of the money intended for Williams' account which he would have had to pay to these persons. After making these payments the balance was handed to Williams as per his account to meet urgent bills which he was rushing around to pay to clear the boat. I had not a minute's time to go into any details, because beside looking after needs of ship, I had to be then raising the money to cover the expenses that ran into more than six thousand dollars. All the receipts for monies paid out by me for Williams' account with

the exception of taxi hire were in my brief case along with other documents. I had them with me with the intent of straightening out the Williams account on the return of the ship. I was arrested on train about seven days after I cleared ship from Norfolk. I handed my brief case to my wife at the station and asked her to turn the papers over to Mr. plains the difference of three hundred and fifty dollars in the Williams' The receipts were for Williams to balance his books with the receipts

through me from my secretary, Miss Parham. Neither the treasurer nor the auditor paid me the compliment to ask by letter or otherwise my part in the transaction, yet my name is used in such a peculiar manner. I demand a retraction of the statement. This is indeed ingratitude for tremendous effort made with a fifty dollar advance to clear the boat on an anticipated business trip, sailing from Norfolk without a penny's worth of debt. This explanation must have the same circulation as the state. ment. I think it an unfair advantage taken of a man in prison who has no means of defending himself on the spot.

MARCUS GARVEY. P. S. The very fact that the supplies were received and no other charges were made for them should have suggested to any one that the transaction was regular. I advise that the suppliers, chandlers and agents in Philadelphia be communicated with for duplicate receipts.

# SLAVERY IN BURMA FINALLY ABOLISHED

LONDON, March 23 .- Official advices have reached London from Rangoon that slavery at last has been sup pressed in Burma.

All slaves in the Hukawng Valley to the number of 3.487, have been released as a result of representations made to the Naga chiefs by J. T. O Barnard, Deputy Commissioner of the Burma Frontier Service, who headed government party on a visit to that territory a few months ago. Sir Har-court Butler, Governor of Burma, who visited the Hukawng Valley a year ago with an escort of 110 military police and opened negotiations for the ing of slaves, has congratulated Mr. Barnard and the members of his party. He said he believed slavery, as well as head-hunting, still existed in remote parts of Burma, but the time soon would come when these abominable practices would be blotted out com-

Until recently the Naga tribes have been in the habit of kidnapping annually about fifty boys and girls from Assam.

When interviewed by Sir Harcourt Butler last year the chiefs politely, but firmly, defended the practices of slavery and human sacrifice and refused to discontinue them. The Governor, however, called a durbar, at

Even the important base camp of Ain Aicha on the Aurgha has not been free from desultory attacks. Certain tribes which during last month were submitting are again wavering under the nace of enemy reprisals.

The optimism expressed, especially in Paris and Madrid, does not find an enthusiastic echo in this country. No doubt Abd-el-Krim has not the means he formerly had of carrying on the war and there is a great scarcity of food among the tribes, threatening famine, but his adherents despite hardships and suffering appear again disposed to sacrifice themselves for their leader and his cause.

Certain French newspapers in Morocco continue to publish articles stating that the Riff country is kept going by British moral and material support and that the ultimate aim is a Riffian republic under British protection By doing so they merely encourage fu-ture hopes among the Riffians, and Abd-el-Krim himself uses these French newspaper articles as propaganda among the tribesmen.

He has never ceased to promise his adherents ultimate British intervention in his favor, and this confirmation of his statements in the French press in Morocco plays strongly into his hands.

# THE PERSECUTION OF ROTHSCHILD FRANCIS

NEW YORK, March 25 .- For printing without comment a report of the America - "-il Liberties Union upon the hearing of his own appeal in the Court of Appeals at Philadelphia, Rothschild Francis, Virgin Islands editor and legislator, has been ordered to appear before the district court at St. Thomas on a second charge of contempt of court.

The Civil Liberties Union report, sent to the Negro press of the country, leclared that Francis was defended before the Philadelphia court on appeal from two sentences, one for criminal libel and the other for contempt of court. He was sentenced by George Washington Williams, district judge of the islands, whose appointment Francis had opposed, for printing an article criticizing a native policeman. The report declared that the federal court at Philadelphia, upon reversing the conviction on the libel charge, scored Judge Williams for trying to use libel laws to regulate the press. sustained the sentence of thirty days for contempt of court, a caswhich grew out of an editorial by Francis in his "Emancipator," charg-ing that he had been "railroaded" in the libel case.

Upon receiving the summons to appear in Judge Williams' court on s contempt charge for printing the reoort, Francis immediately cabled the Union for aid. He was advised to plead not guilty and take appeal. The contempt proceedings are based espe-
