Assurances that Abd-el-Krim is still master of Rif and is convinced that he has still a chance to win independence for his people were given by Tangier today by Hans Alexander Langlet, a journalist representing the Stockholm Tidningen, who has just passed two months in the Rif territory in intimate association with Abd-el-Krim.

The Rifian chief told him, Langlet said, that even if he went against him he and his people were prepared to make their way through the Spanish lines near Tetuan.

Langlet said he was bringing no peace proposals from Abd-el-Krim and that his journey there had been solely for the purpose of studying the Rifian situation.

"Abd-el-Krim, according to the Swedish journalist, is a man of great ability and considerable courage. He still commands the devotion of the Rifians. He is the soul of the tribal chiefs, who sometimes have quarrels with each other, but remain always loyal to him.

Aside from Rifian troop concentrations and local raids the entire war zone is quiet.

"Peace Offensive" Planned

RABAT, April 2.—At a very moment when negotiations for ending the war in Morocco appear to be well under way and when the feeling in French and Spanish camps is that peace is in the air, information is drifting in from a dozen sources indicating that Abd-el-Krim is about to launch a series of heavy attacks against the European forces.

These attacks, according to opinion here in the military and political capital of French Morocco, will be in the nature of a peace offensive. They will be designed, the French believe, to impress Paris and Madrid with the strength of the Rifians at a time when their governments are considering what concessions are necessary to conclude a peace settlement.

Heavy concentrations of Rifian troops have been sighted opposite the French and Spanish lines. The French and Spanish expect that these troops will be used to capture the Rifian towns and to force the European forces to evacuate the Rifian territory.

LET'S PUT IT OVER BRITISH JUSTICE ON TRIAL

BRITISH Court, a British Judge, holding the position of Chief Justice in the Colony of British Honduras, Central America, has recently rendered a decision in a case on which the eyes of the Negroes of the world are riveted.

Mr. Isaiah E. Morter, a member of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, died a year and a half ago, and cutting off his relatives with meagre bequests, gave the greater portion of his estate, estimated conservatively at \$150,000, to "The African Redemption Fund" of the Association.

Now the Supreme Court of British Honduras has nullified the bequest to the "Universal Negro Improvement Association on the ground that it is "illegal for purposes," meaning the redemption of Africa.

We are amazed. But we refuse to believe that British justice will permanently record that it is "illegal" for black men to aspire to and make efforts for the redemption of their God-given Africa from the hands of those who maltreat and exploit and virtually enslave them.

SAVE THE ASSOCIATION BECAUSE THE RACE NEEDS IT

THERE is not a 100 cent member of the Universal Negro Improvement Association who does not appreciate the great good the association has done in arousing the Negro people everywhere to the importance of saving race values for the race itself.
