DECLARATION OF RIGHTS OF NEGRO PEOPLES OF THE WORLD

In order to encourage our race all over the world and to stimulate it to a higher and grander destiny, we demand and insist on the following Declaration of Rights:

1. "Be it known to all men that whereas, all men are created equal and entitled to the rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, and because of this we, the duly elected representatives of the Negro peoples of the world, invoking the aid of the just and Almighty God to declare all men, women and children of our blood throughout the world free citizens, and do claim them as free citizens of Africa, the Motherland of all Negroes."

2. "That we believe in the supreme authority of our race in all things racial; that all things are created and given to men as a common possession; that there should be an equitable distribution and apportionment of all such things, and in consideration of the fact that as a race we are now deprived of those things that are morally and legally ours, we believe it right that all such things should be acquired and held by whatsoever means possible."

3. "That we believe the Negro, like any other race, should be governed by the ethics of civilization, and, therefore, should not be deprived of any of those rights or privileges common to other human beings."

4. "We declare that Negroes, whosoever they form a community among themselves, should be given the right to elect their own representatives to represent them in legislatures, courts of law, or such institutions as may exercise control over that particular community."

5. "We assert that the Negro is entitled to even-handed justice before all courts of law and equity in whatever country he may be found, and when this is denied him on account of his race or color such denial is an insult to the race as a whole and should be resented by the entire body of Negroes."

6. "We declare it unfair and prejudicial to the rights of Negroes in communities where they exist in considerable numbers to be tried by a judge and jury composed entirely of an alien race, but in all such cases members of our race are entitled to representation on the jury."

7. "We believe that any law or practice that tends to deprive any African of his land or the privileges of free citizenship within his country is unjust and immoral, and no native should respect any such law or practice."

8. "We declare taxation without representation unjust and tyrannous, and there should be no obligation on the part of the Negro to obey the levy of a tax by any law-making body from which he is excluded and denied representation on account of his race or color."

9. "We believe that any law especially directed against the Negro to his detriment and singling him out because of his race or color is unfair and immoral, and should not be respected."

10. "We believe all men entitled to common human respect, and that our race should in no way tolerate any insults that may be interpreted to mean disrespect to our color."

11. "We deprecate the use of the term 'nigger' as applied to Negroes, and demand that the word 'Negro' be written with a capital 'N'."

12. "We believe that the Negro should adopt every means to protect himself against barbarous practices inflicted upon him because of color."

13. "We believe in the freedom of Africa for the Negro people of the world, and, by the principle of Europe for the Europeans and Asia for the Asiatics, we also demand Africa for the Africans at home and abroad."

14. "We believe in the inherent right of the Negro to possess himself of Africa, and that his possession of same shall not be regarded as an infringement on any claim or purchase made by any race or nation."

15. "We strongly condemn the cupidity of those nations of the world who, by open aggression, or secret schemes, have seized the territories and inexhaustible natural wealth of Africa, and we place on record our most solemn declaration to reclaim the treasures and possession of the vast continent of our forefathers."

16. "We believe all men should live in peace one with the other, but when races and nations provoke the ire of other races and nations by attempting to infringe upon their rights, war becomes inevitable, and the attempt in any way to free one's self or protect one's rights or heritage becomes justifiable."

17. "Whereas, The lynching, by burning, hanging, or any other means, of human beings is a barbarous practice, and a shame and disgrace to civilization, we therefore declare any country guilty of such atrocities outside the pale of civilization."

18. "We protest against the atrocious crime of whipping, flogging and overworking of the native tribes of Africa and Negroes everywhere. These are methods that should be abolished, and all means should be taken to prevent a continuance of such brutal practices."

19. "We protest against the atrocious practice of shaving the heads of Africans, especially of African women or individuals of Negro blood, when placed in prison as a punishment for crime by an alien race."

20. "We protest against segregated districts, separate public conveyances, industrial discrimination, lynchings and limitations of political privileges of any Negro citizen in any part of the world on account of race, color or creed, and will exert our full influence and power against all such."

21. "We protest against any punishment inflicted upon a Negro with severity, as against lighter punishment inflicted upon another of an alien race for like offense, as an act of prejudice and injustice, and should be resented by the entire race."

22. "We protest against the system of education in any country where Negroes are denied the same privileges and advantages as other races."

23. "We declare it inhuman and unfair to boycott Negroes from industries and labor in any part of the world."

24. "We believe in the doctrine of the freedom of the press, and we therefore emphatically protest against the suppression of Negro newspapers and periodicals in various parts of the world, and call upon Negroes everywhere to employ all available means to prevent such suppression."

25. "We further demand free speech universally for all men."

26. "We hereby protest against the publication of scandalous and inflammatory articles by an alien press tending to create racial strife and the exhibition of picture films showing the Negro as a cannibal."

27. "We believe in the self-determination of all peoples."

28. "We declare for the freedom of religious worship."

29. "With the help of Almighty God, we declare ourselves the sworn protectors of the honor and virtue of our women and children, and pledge our lives for their protection and defense everywhere, and under all circumstances from wrongs and outrages."

30. "We demand the right of unlimited and unprejudiced education for ourselves and our posterity forever."

31. "We declare that the teaching in any school by alien teachers to our boys and girls, that the alien race is superior to the Negro race, is an insult to the Negro people of the world."

32. "Where Negroes form a part of the citizenry of any country, and pass the civil service examination of such country, we declare them entitled to the same consideration as other citizens as to appointments in such civil service."

33. "We vigorously protest against the increasingly unfair and unjust treatment accorded Negro travelers on land and sea by the agents and employees of railroad and steamship companies and insist that for equal fare we receive equal privileges with travelers of other races."

34. "We declare it unjust for any country, State, or nation to enact laws tending to hinder and obstruct the free immigration of Negroes on account of their race and color."

35. "That the right of the Negro to travel unmolested throughout the world be not abridged by any person or persons, and all Negroes are called upon to give aid to a fellow-Negro when thus molested."


36. "We declare that all Negroes are entitled to the same right to travel over the world as other men."

37. "We hereby demand that the governments of the world recognize our leader and his representatives chosen by the race to look after the welfare of our people under such governments."

38. "We demand complete control of our social institutions without interference by any alien race or races."

39. "That the colors, Red, Black and Green, be the colors of the Negro race."

40. "Resolved, That the anthem, 'Ethiopia, Thou Land of Our Fathers,' etc., shall be the anthem of the Negro race."

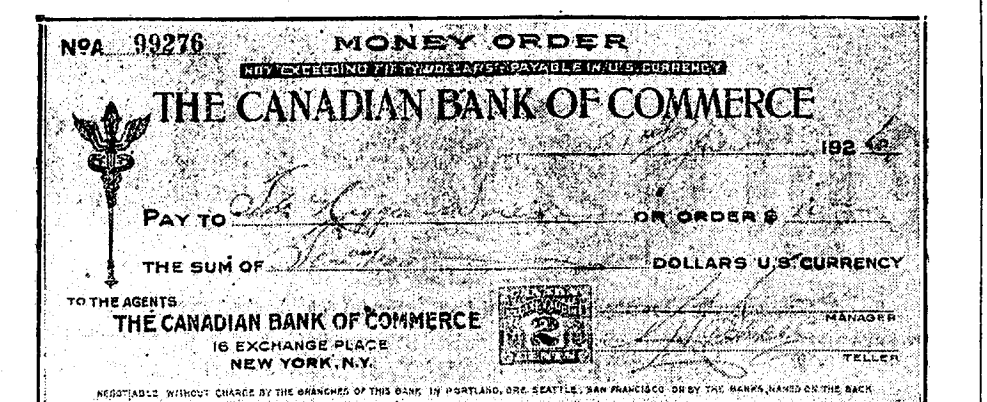

LET'S PUT IT OVER

A UNIVERSITY ON THE JAMES RIVER

The members of the Universal Negro Improvement Association were thrilled through and through last week by the announcement made by Dr. J. G. St. Clair Drake, international organizer, at the Sunday night meeting of the New York Local in Commonwealth Hall and by publication in the last issue of the Negro World, of the acquisition by the Association of the Smallwood-Corley Industrial Institute, located at Clarendon, Virginia, on the James River, where the second batch of African slaves were landed in 1622. This valuable property has been conveyed to the Association for \$53,000, the mortgaged indebtedness against the property valued at \$250,000, which the Association assumes, and should have no trouble in caring for. Prof. Caleb B. Robinson, a member of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, is president and Dr. Drake is vice-president of the Institute, and the transfer of the valuable property was secured through the efforts of these two distinguished members.

The property comprises some sixty-six acres of land fronting for a mile on the James River, with nine buildings, and can easily be developed into a great international university which will be one of the greatest educational institutions controlled by Negro people. All of the possibilities are present in the institution as it now stands, and the development will be steady and sure along the university lines President-General Marcus Garvey has long had in mind. The possibilities of such a university in helping towards the accomplishment of the purposes of the Universal Negro Improvement Association cannot be overestimated.

The editor of the Negro World was well acquainted with Rev. John J. Smallwood, the founder of the school, and had the honor of the commencement orator of the school many years ago, when he had an opportunity to appreciate the advantages of the property, with its historical background, for the development of a great Negro University—an international university, if you please, which should appeal to Negro youth in the United States, in the West Indies, in Africa and in the islands of the sea. He let his imagination run riot, for he was then young and saw visions and dreamed dreams. He hardly looked so far ahead as to envisage the realization of the just and the dreams.

Just how much the future well-being of the Negro people hangs upon systematic education of the essentials of the requirements of modern civilization, in which race consciousness of its own social, civil and economic values shall be thoroughly inculcated as a basic principle, it is not difficult to imagine. The Jews understand this principle very well and have established a university on Mount Scopus in the Land of Promise to teach the principle to all. We need more educated men and women who know how to think and to do things, and we must educate them if we shall have them. A great university is the place to educate them.

The Parent Body needs and has asked for \$10,000 to begin the good and needed work at Clarendon and we are sure the membership will promptly give what has been asked of it.

GAG LAW IN SOUTH AFRICA

IGNORANCE, disorganization and negation of leadership are always the weapons which usurpers employ against those whom they have subjugated and rule without their consent. The slaveholders in the United States before the civil war employed these weapons against white and black enemies alike of the vile system. They made martyrs of white men who dared to teach the people and to organize and lead them against the existence and spread of the slave system in the United States, and they crucified any Negro whom they found trying to teach his brethren the way to manhood and freedom. COLUMBIA TO OPEN PORTO RICO SCHOOL

Exercises at Tropical Medicine Institution to Be Held on Sept. 22—Several U. S. Professors to Direct Enterprise
NEW YORK, July 25.—The School of Tropical Medicine at Columbia University, at Porto Rico will hold its opening exercises Sept. 22, according to an announcement yesterday.

Dr. Robert A. Lambert of New York, the famous pathologist and scientific investigator, is to direct the school. The physical equipment includes laboratories in which investigations in bacteriology, chemistry, physiology, pathology and parasitology will be carried on.

Cooperating with the new institution will be the Plagues Prevention Laboratory of the Porto Rico Department of Health and the Insular Leper Hospital. Temporary laboratories for field work will be provided.

The school of Tropical Medicine is financed chiefly by the Government of Porto Rico. It was formally established by the 1924 legislative assembly under the leadership of Don Antonio Durech, President of the Senate.

The program to be followed in the school is outlined in Columbia, two Columbia University, will be in addition to Dr. Lambert are among the professors at the new school. They are Don Antonio Durech, Professor of Chemistry and William A. Hoffman, Assistant Professor of Parasitology.

Other members of the faculty are: Francisco J. Hernandez, Professor of Clinical Bacteriology; Pedro Gutierrez Ovaroa, member of the faculty in the same department; Isaac Gonzalez Martinez, Clinical Professor of Tropical Medicine; Arturo Torregrossa, Clinical Professor of Tropical Medicine.

Dr. A. P. Phelps, professor of Sanitary Science, Institute of Public Health, Columbia University, will be a visiting professor in the Fall of 1926. Other members of the faculty of Columbia now developing a similar program under the direction of Professor Dr. Emerson, with the aid of Dr. C. Cook, Assistant Professor of Joseph R. De Lamar, will cooperate. Fourteen instructors and six resident lecturers have been appointed.

Imagination and the Posture of Your Child
Your blood would boil, as the saying goes, if you would become justly indignant. If you are concerned such a remark about yourself, of course you have imagination. If you didn't have there would not be any fun in life. You have imagination about the future of your family, of your job, of yourself.

Do your imagination in regard to the future of your child, make you give some thought to his posture? Posture concerns everyone from the standpoint of health, beauty and economic outlook. Correct posture means a well-balanced body, and a greater resistance to disease.

Have you thought about that? You are told enough to watch your own posture. Have you imagination to look ahead ten years for your child? If you are concerned about the future habits of good health and good posture now, do you see that in ten years he will be an upright, well-developed man of good character and healthy than he would be if he had neglected his posture in his childhood?

One of the most common forms of bad posture is round shoulders. Corrective exercises, in consistently throwing the shoulders back with the arms fully extended to one side, or in raising the head, will correct this. At the same time drawing a deep breath and dropping the arms slowly during the breath, keeping the head in a straight line that bespeaks co-ordination between the parts of the body, and between body and mind.
