Is Held by the White Man in a Prison Cell

As far back as 1921 he was using all his influence and ability to ward off a clash of races by revealing to the Negro the futility of the program he was pursuing under hand-picked leaders of no vision.

The Negro World takes pleasure in presenting to its readers the following excerpt from a speech delivered by the Hon. Marcus Garvey at the Pythian Temple, Washington, D. C., on November 20, 1921. Further instalments of this remarkable address will be published in succeeding issues:

More and more the world is getting away from accident. More and more the world is coming up to facts and figures. More and more the world is dividing itself up into parts—parts Japanese, parts Chinese, parts Hindoo, parts French, parts German, and we think that the time has come when we should get into the parts African.

Now some of us do not like to hear about this word African. To me it is the strongest and healthiest word in the whole world. Negroes are the only people in the world who do not feel proud of their nationality. Take the Jew. Whatsoever you do to him, whatsoever you say to him, he will beat his chest and say, "Yes, I am a Jew." Beat the German, call him a Hun, any other name you care, and he will stand up and say, "Yes, I am a German." But everybody wants to get away from being a Negro. What is the matter with it? What is the matter?

We have come to the turning-point of civilization. There is no getting away from it. Humanity has reached the cross roads of time, and each race and nation is traveling in its own direction. Negroes do not believe that they can continue to travel with the other races of the world because these races are not counting on traveling with them, except to have them carry their baggage.

If you think that the Chinese is taking you into account, if you think that the Japanese is taking you into account, if you think that the Anglo-Saxon is taking you into account, if you think that the white American is taking you into account, you are making a tremendous mistake. That is the mistake we have made so much in the past, and too many of us are inclined to continue making that mistake. When white men speak, Negroes believe they mean whatsoever they say. That is the trouble now. Some of us claim, "Well, we are citizens here and citizens there, and the constitution is ours." Why, when certain people were making the constitution, they never remembered Negroes at all. When the fathers of British liberty were writing the constitution of freedom, when they wrested from the hand of King John the Magna Charta, they never had Negroes in thought, they never had Negroes in mind. When the fathers of American independence were giving their constitution to the world, they never had us in mind. It is only by accident we find ourselves living under these respective constitutions. And the white people know it.

There is this one thing I want to settle in your minds: There is no man in the world that is going to give to the other fellow that which he has worked for—on easy terms. It is not human. That is to say, if the one man builds his house, builds his beautiful home, furnishes it with the best of everything, the best of equipment, it is unreasonable for you to expect that he is going to get out of his home and let you come in and live for nothing. That is not human. That might be angelic, but we will have to wait until we get to Heaven to see that. There is not one man who would go out and toil and toil and toil by the sweat of his brow and build up a beautiful mansion and furnish it, have a beautiful Italian garden, pictures and everything inside, the home well decorated, and then go out and say, "There is a fine home I built; go and live there; I don't want it." Which of you will do that? Which of you? None of you. And that is what we expect the world to do for us.

Negroes Blind Who Fail to Follow Garvey

To the Editor of the Negro World:

We have a great number of institutions, headed by as many Negro leaders, in these United States of America, all presumably struggling in an effort to raise the head of the Negro out of a long established and skillfully dug pool of social, economic and political mire. Chief among these are the Tuskegee Institute, founded by the late Dr. Booker T. Washington and now headed by the learned Dr. Robert R. Moton, with its "drop your bucket where you are" policy; the great (?) National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, headed by the eminent and learned professor, W. E. B. du Bois of Harvard, Yale, Princeton and Berlin, with its request and appeal for social equality, as if the granting were probable; and the Universal Negro Improvement Association and African Communities League, founded and headed by Marcus Garvey, a native of St. Ann's, Jamaica, British West Indies, and known by no one eight years ago, with its demand as evidenced in the cry of "Africa for the Africans, at home and abroad."

In view of what is supposed to be the fact that these institutions are all trying "to get the Negro from under" their own respective ways, one is inclined to ask the question, Why is it that the other institutions have been given the stamp of approval and receive financial aid from the power that be, while the Universal Negro Improvement Association and African Communities League has been branded as impractical and received only the "vest" condemnations from the same powers that be? Why is it that the "other leaders" are praised and hailed as intellectual giants of the race and recorded a cordial portion of gratitude, while Marcus Garvey is painted as a demagogue, a czar, a lunatic, a dreamer and a fraud and is cast into a Federal prison as a common felon?

Answering these questions is quite simple. The other Negro institutions are to the powers that be what a Catholic school is to the Catholic Church, while Marcus Garvey, the man with a real cure for the world's headache, unlike other "leaders," is not disposed to spend half an hour winking the dust of his feet on the mat at the back door, with his hat in hand, his eyes fixed on the floor and answering "yes, sir," to whatever he is told. In this he stands alone, and for this millions of black men, women and children of the world over love him.

If Marcus Garvey had conceived and organized a "National Negro Improvement Association," without the African Communities League, that would have been all right, but when, in addition to this, he went so far, so very far, as to have conceived and founded a Black Star Line of steamships, not on paper but with several steamships actually purchased to cross the great Atlantic Ocean for the

purpose of linking the Negroes of the West Indies with those of Africa, North, South and Central America, Europe and Australia, he had deliberately stepped out of the Christian bari-er; he was apprehended and reprimanded, but when he again organized the Black Cross Navigation and Trading Company, Inc., with the same objective in view, like Moses, he had broken the tablet; and as Moses was buried where no one knows, so, too, Marcus Garvey is "buried within the gray walls of Atlanta Penitentiary" as an award for this revolting crime against the white man's doctrines.

'Tis sad, but sad as it is, 'tis true. If this unchristian, harsh, brutal and decidedly unwarranted treatment of a Negro who has risen from total obscurity on his own initiative during the past eight years to a position of universal eminence shows anything it shows that there is absolutely no hope for the Negro under the present order of things and that all talk about agriculture, social, economic and political equality for the black man is nothing more than a "sortie of bunkum."

It shows, too, that the Negro must either "get out from under" on his own transport or stay under and be crushed by the bestial iron heels of western tyranny, otherwise known as civilization. Marcus Garvey has seen the iceberg and is determined that the "old transport Ethiopia" shall not take the course of the ill-fated Titanic. Black men and women everywhere should rally to the voice of this rare and peculiar character. The writer is afraid only of God the Creator, and sees in Marcus Garvey what the American people see in Mr. Calvin Coolidge, what the French see in Aristide Briand, the English in Stanley Baldwin, the Italians in Benito Mussolini and the Chinese in Chen. We are in profound sympathy with any black man or woman who does not see as much in Marcus Garvey, and would recommend to them either the services of a competent oculist or an expert brain specialist.

Darker Peoples Struggle for Freedom

To the Editor of the Negro World:

Permit me space in your invaluable paper to say a few words in laudation of the indomitable spirit of our matchless and heroic leader, the Hon. Marcus Garvey, who now languishes in Atlanta penitentiary.

In this age of racial unrest, when the darker peoples of the world are struggling for political independence and social equality, when oppressed millions of Chinese, Indians, Negroes and Filipinos are determined that there shall be liberty or death, our noble leader has come on the scene for just such a time as this.

He came on the scene like a whirlwind swept into a mighty organization millions of black men and women

throughout the world. The broken cords of self-knowledge, self-reverence and self-determination which lay slumbering in the Negro's breast from time immemorial, mysteriously vibrated to his magic touch and, for once in the history of race, demonstrated to the world that Negroes who heretofore could not be organized, can be, under a great leader with a program, with vision and with almost superhuman confidence in the possibilities of his people, organized into a mighty force that no power on earth can destroy. He has wrought a miracle. He is a prophet sent from God. What man or angel of God would have the courage and the audacity in the face of the great organized powers that hold us in ignorance, poverty and slavery to come forward and in uncompromising terms declare for Negro liberty and national independence? What man without a divine commission could have withstood the powers that be and endured with wonderful equanimity the hatred and slander and persecution of the very people whose cause he championed? What man not endowed with the spirit of a prophet could have stood up in the midst of universal opposition and spoken out in such power and gentleness, self-righteousness and confidence in his mission or confidence in his people. No other leader of the world, except Jesus, has ever been filled with such buoyant optimism and such radiant faith in the final triumph of his cause as the Hon. Marcus Garvey. He is a prophet not only to the oppressed peoples of the world, but to the imperialistic nations also, whose hands are stained with their brothers' blood. He is warning the latter in Booker T. Washington's mortal lines that:

"The laws of changeless justice bind Oppressor with the oppressed, And close as sin and suffering joined We march to fate abreast."

He is teaching the world a great lesson, that there must be character and backbone and manhood and sacrifice in leadership. He is demonstrating to the world the sterling virtues of the Negro that lie pent up in his being without expression for want of opportunity.

He is also teaching the world the meaning of a Christian. The Landgrave of Hesse was once asked, "How could you bear your imprisonment so well?" He answered: "The divine consolations of martyrs were with me." Surely the divine consolations of martyrs are with the Hon. Marcus Garvey. He is an ideal Christian in whose personality grace and truth have triumphed. This triumph is the fruit of service. He is showing to the world that the way to triumph is to dedicate one's self to a worthy cause and to stick to that cause perseveringly amidst opposition, suffering, misunderstanding and imprisonment until victory is achieved.
