“I Am A Negro”

The following is an extract from Marcus Garvey's famous speech to the jury on the occasion of his celebrated trial, printed in his book, "Philosophy and Opinions of Marcus Garvey," or "Africa for the Africans," volume II:

“I am a Negro. I make absolutely no apology for being a Negro because my God created me to be what I am, and as I am so will I return to my God, for He knows just why He created me as He did. So, gentlemen, you will understand that behind the whole business proposition lies the spirit of the movement. I have no time to go into the work of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, but I say this: I know there are certain people who do not like me because I am black; they don't like me because I am not born here, though no fault of mine.

“I didn't bring myself into this western world. You know the history of my race. I was brought here; I was sold to some slave master in the island of Jamaica. Some Irish slave master who subsequently gave my great grandfather his name. Garvey is not an African name; it is an Irish name, as Johnson is not an African name, Garcia is not an African name, Thompson and Tobias are not African names. Where did we get those names from? We inherited them from our own slave masters, English, French, Irish or Scotch. So, if I was born in Jamaica, it was no fault of mine. It was because that slave ship which took me to Jamaica did not come to American ports. That is how some Negroes of America were not born in the West Indies.

“We did not come here of our own free will. We were brought here, and so the question of birth does not enter into the question of the Negro. It was a matter of accident. Will you blame me for the accident of being a Jamaican Negro and not an American Negro? Surely you will not. But there is a bigger question involved. It is a question of race. What are you going to do with this question of race? You may sit quietly by, but it is going to be serious later on, and that is why the Universal Negro Improvement Association is endeavoring to assist you in solving the Negro problem by helping the Negro to become enterprising, independent politically, and by having a country of his own. If you follow me down the ages you will see within a hundred years you are going to have a terrible race problem in America, when you will have increased and the country will become over-populated. It will be a fight for existence between two opposite races. The weak will have to go down in defeat before the strong. In the riots of Washington, East St. Louis, Chicago, Tulsa, study the race question and you will find that some serious thinking must be done now to solve this problem; otherwise our children will be confronted with it. Do you know when you want bread and the other fellow wants it, when there is only one loaf—what is going to happen? Enmity and pressure are going to spring up and a fight will ensue. That is why the Universal Negro Improvement Association has started this proposition to redeem Africa and build up a country of our own, so as not to molest you in the country your fathers founded hundreds of years ago.”

H. R. H. Prince William of Sweden has paid a visit to the land of mystery and adventure. On his return he is giving a series of lectures...

Tuesday evening, November 8, the famous traveler and explorer was introduced to Oakland "society" under the direction of the Oakland Forum.

"Hunting Big Game in Pymy Land" was the subject of the lecture. The film, however, showed more photographs of the natives and their abject poverty than of the subject proper.

In substance, the information concerning the native life was of greater interest than the experiences of the jungle life. "Wild Animals" is merely another form of Nordic camouflage to better study the African people.

Among some of the items pertaining to "Awakening Africa" were: That where the natives formerly gave away valuable concessions for a few colored beads, today they are demanding CASH!

Without the native guides the white explorers are severely handicapped. Negroes of the Western world must save their African brothers.

U. N. I. A. Will Convert All Negroes in Time

To the Editor of The Negro World: As one goes along in the ranks of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, he finds himself being confronted by three classes of pessimists.

But after reading the extract from the "New Era" of Eunice, Louisiana, in reply to some previous article or other (which was apparently written by a Negro) when the white writer among other things stated to the Negroes in general that rope and gunpowder has kept them in submission for many years, and if there is not an

unexpected shortage of this rope and gunpowder on the market they will continue to afford them with their constitutional rights, I wonder what those Negro pessimists have to say?

Just think of the ambition of those Negroes who are satisfied to sit in a white man's country and allow the white man to be telling them about rope and gunpowder. Instead of getting busy and doing the things which the white man did to get his country they started to put up an argument about social equality, etc.

There is Africa, the country which I ever have to say is ours by divine inheritance. There is the possibility of us getting down there and joining with our brethren who are there and making it as good and attractive as any of the white man's countries. Why shouldn't we put ourselves in the position to guide our own destiny, dictate to the aliens in our country, and tell them about not only rope and gunpowder but about cannon, submarines, warships, airplanes, etc?

No well thinking Negro will take exception to the writer of that article's expressions or assertions. In my opinion, such things help up those Negroes who are clamoring for social equality, instead of a government of their own. When the subject of "back to Africa" is put to some Negroes they say that they haven't got to go back to Africa or they have not lost anything there. But if I understand the thing the right way, the U. N. I. A. is not inviting every Negro to go back to Africa. The idea is to set up a government in Africa which will maintain an army and navy for its protection, not unlike the other races and nations.

Every Englishman is not at his home, neither is every American, nor German, Italian, etc., etc., but their governments are at their services at any time. In every country they go, there is a representative of their government, someone looking like them, to represent them. Such are the things the U. N. I. A. is aiming at.

Naturally it would not be a pleasant thing to see all of us from this western world flocking down in Africa. Africa really could not find any use for some of us with our continuous rounds of arguments and misunderstandings. Notwithstanding opposition I believe are long the well will be lifted from the eyes of our Negro pessimists, and whatever the seeming setbacks of the Association might be, they will look on them from an optimistic point of view and resolve to carry on until our objective is reached.

Interracial Co-operation

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Nov. 10.—Reorganization of the local interracial committee, with an unusually strong and representative personnel on both sides, was accomplished here a few days ago, and the new committee has already entered earnestly upon its work.

It is headed by former Mayor T. C. Thompson, with Dr. L. L. Patton as chairman of the colored section, L. M. Thomas and G. W. Franklin vice-chairmen, A. M. Pennybacker and Rev. J. B. Barber secretaries, and W. J. Dodge treasurer.

The reorganization was accomplished at a meeting attended by about forty people. The membership of the new committee, composed of about the same number, was so chosen as to represent all the more important civic, religious, commercial and industrial organizations of the city, including the Chamber of Commerce and the Manufacturers' Association. Two meetings a month will be held.

On recommendation of Rev. J. B. Barber and G. W. Franklin of the colored section the following were adopted as the committee's immediate objectives: Better living conditions, including housing and streets; closer and more sympathetic working contacts between the races, and an aggressive campaign in behalf of law observance and good citizenship. The first gun in the law and order campaign was fired by the leading colored pastors on Sunday, October 2, in able sermons on Christian citizenship and respect for law.

In the early days of the interracial movement the Chattanooga committee was a valuable factor in the improvement of interracial attitudes and conditions. In view of its extraordinary and representative personnel, it is believed that the new committee has before it a future of great usefulness.

One-Half Visible in United States

Since gold is the basis of our own currency as well as of that of a large number of other nations, the gold holdings of the United States are of great importance not only in this country, but in the economic scheme of the world.

In the last two years many nations have returned to the gold standard, marking an improvement in the international economic and financial situation. In many recent months there has been little change in the gold movement, but in spite of the preaching of economists that it would be better if the gold supply were distributed, the metal continues to come to the United States. A gold export movement started in 1924, but it did not last.

Balance of trade and other factors brought it back to this country. The recent import movement, however, has been slight compared to that in the year 1920 to 1924. In this period about \$1,700,000,000 came to this country, without notice except to those who follow international financial transactions closely.

The monetary stock of gold held by the United States reached its highest point in the history of this country on December 1, 1924, when it amounted to \$4,870,000,000. It again reached the \$4,800,000,000 mark on July 1, 1926. Since 1923 the gold stock in this country has equaled about one-half of the visible stock of gold in the world. Our present stock is 2.4 times as great as it was in 1913.—New York Sun.

Earthquake Drills Given Children in Japan

TOKIO (A.P.)—As Japan is a country of earthquakes and seismic catastrophe may happen at any time, school children are being drilled in the avoidance of casualties accompanying severe earth disturbance.

In most primary schools the heavy wooden tops of the desks are not screwed down, but may be lifted from the grooves into which they are fitted. The children are drilled to lift off the desks tops at a signal from the teachers, and to hold them over their heads as they march calmly from the room.

In past earthquakes it has been found that many persons were knocked unconsciously by falling parts of ceilings. The desks tops will do much to protect the heads of school children when an earth shock happens, and will enable them to escape to the open air. Since the great disaster of 1923 there have been approximately 30,000 large and minor earthquakes in Japan.
