No human apologies are needed for the moving or going forward of any people, so none will expect that we will apologize for the efforts we are making to unite our race the world over, and the creating for ourselves of a political superstate wherein we will find the representation and protection that will make us secure in the selfish adjustment of a material world.

Go ahead, Negroes, and organize yourselves! You are serving your race and guaranteeing to posterity of our own an existence which otherwise will be denied them.

Ignore the traps of persuasion, advice and alien leadership. No one can be as true to you as you can be to yourself. To suggest that there is no need for Negro racial organization in a well-planned and arranged civilization like that of the twentieth century is, by the game of deception, but to lay the trap for the destruction of a people whose knowledge of life is incomplete, owing to their misunderstanding of man's purpose in creation.

Harlem Hospital Will Soon Double Accommodations

As a result of the recent appropriation of \$1,000,000 by the Board of Estimate, Harlem Hospital will be nearly doubled in size.

Located on one of the most congested districts of the city, the institution has long been in need of additional facilities, and the recent appropriation of \$1,000,000 by the Board of Estimate makes it possible.

A new pavilion to accommodate 250 patients is to be constructed at a cost of \$1,000,000, the present number of beds is to be doubled in size, and the power house and boiler room are to be enlarged.

In the present quarters of the institution more than 2,000 patients are hospitalized yearly, 80 to 90 per cent of them being colored.
