“Buckle On National Armor” Says Marcus Garvey In Inspiring Message From British Capital

Fellowmen of the Negro Race, Greeting:

I am hoping that every member of the race is thinking, as I am at the present time, in terms of racial self-reliance and progress.

Anglo-Saxon Activities

Located, as I am, in an environment of Anglo-Saxon activities, I am very much impressed with the great possibilities confronting us as a growing and ambitious people.

Great and Mighty City

London is a great and mighty city, the largest in the world. All that one can see around is the result and product of the white man's brain and energy. I am wondering how long it will take the Negro to duplicate the white man's achievements in nation-building and government. It seems so easy, with a little bit of determined effort, to put over a program like that of the U. N. I. A.

Negro to Find Himself

I am determined to use all the power and influence I have to help the Negro to find himself. Here in Europe, and particularly in England, even as in America, the Negro is lost to himself; everything is the other man's. The Negro is regarded as a child of circumstance and an unfortunate object of charity. This should not be so. The time has come for the Negro to be a man.

Strike Out Independently

Not until the black man strikes out independently to do for himself and proves his mettle in nation building, commerce, industry, politics and war, will he be rated as one of the forces of the world.

Time Is Opportune

I am praying for the time to come when the black man will be so impregnated with the ambition and desire to be great that no power on earth can keep him back. The time is opportune for a great demonstration of impressing the world with the black man's objects and aspirations. He must make up his mind not to take a second place, not to fawn and bow before the mighty forces of opposition, but like a man climb over every barrier, never resting until he sits on the pinnacle of his ambition.

Speaking to Heart of Europe

In another week I shall be speaking in person to the heart of Europe. Already there is much uneasiness among certain people as to what I am going to say. A certain part of the press here is very uneasy and they have been suggesting to the authorities to stop the meeting because they

are afraid of hearing the truth, that which generally sets men free. But it will be a very hard and difficult thing to stop Marcus Garvey when he is ready to speak on any question affecting the Negro, and he is surely going to give them as much trouble to stop him in Europe, as he did in America, until the Negro is free.

In Europe to Be Heard

I am in Europe to be heard on behalf of the Negro and shall be heard. Another section of the press is quite fair and reasonable, so that opinions are equally divided. The fellows who have been exploiting Africa, also the Negroes in America and the West Indies, are afraid to have the truth told to the conscience of Europe so that they are working hard to prevent me speaking, but things are not done here as they are done in America where politics has no morals. Here you must show just cause and reason before you can interfere with the liberty of a man and surely I shall make them show this. It is time that the conduct and methods of these exploiters of Negroes be told to the people of England, and, incidentally, the people of Europe, and I am going to do it.

Work in Europe

You may rest assured that my work in Europe will be thoroughly done. All I ask is that you keep the home fires burning. After my departure home I feel that a new era will open in Europe for the black man. I say “black man” because he is the man that must be lifted—for it seems that everywhere everybody of color is attempting to pass off either as an Indian, Cuban, Egyptian or something else. It is difficult for the Negro to pass as anything else, for he

is black. We must endeavor to make a strong black race to impress the world so that others will not try to avoid us because of any peculiar treatment to us because we are black. Some of the colored race leaders from America and the West Indies are here passing as Indians, Arabians, Persians, so as to escape the black man; the black man, therefore, must buck up and elevate himself. It takes organization, determination, grit and money and all the other necessary forces to make the Negro what he ought to be, and all of this you should put behind the U. N. I. A. so that we may change the outlook of the black man and emancipate the African, indeed. I am urging every black man and black woman to work harder now than ever before to see that the black race is elevated and standardized; to do otherwise is to live in misery and die in disgrace.

The World and You

The world does not care a smack about you, now, and shall never worry about you until you amount to something. Nobody cares a hang about you; they are only trying to deceive you, so my advice to you is to brace up and buckle on your national armor and go forward to elevate your race and liberate your country. You do this by prosecuting the course of good will and good judgment under the leadership of the Universal Negro Improvement Association, and for that reason I ask you in America, Africa, Central and South America, and the West Indies and all over the world, to rally to the program of the organization.

Risking All

I am doing my best for you. I am risking all because I realize that the work must be done and some one has to do it, so well may I do it as anyone else.

Fooling the Black Man

In America, Africa and the West Indies, the game has been played to fool the black people. Fellows like Du Bois in America are being used to fool all of us. Even fellows like H. C. De Lisser of the West Indies are being used to keep down the Negroes of the Islands. We must be careful and refuse to follow such leadership. When the history of our work is to be written, you will find that men like Du Bois have done more harm than good. Negroes, for God's sake, be careful of such leadership.

PROGRESSIVE POLITICS

THE EYES of the world are turned on Kansas City this week. There a great political battle is in progress to choose the man who will be the Republican standard-bearer in the coming National elections. Many other things of importance will be done there, but they will receive scant notice from the majority of people. The world is mainly interested in who will be the man chosen by one of the two dominant parties to represent it for president. This man may be the last leader of the greatest nation on earth.

The Negro is, of course, playing his part as best he may. He, in common with his political associates, is interested in the choice of a "white man's president" in a "white man's country," but also in things he is fighting, fighting to secure for the 15,000,000 black citizens of America the right that they were supposed to have received more than fifty years ago. Out of 1,089 delegates, we are told that there will be sixty Negroes. Not many, but certainly a voice loud enough to be heard in the wilderness of prejudice called America.

It is interesting to note the gradual political metamorphosis of the Negro in these National conventions. Time was when the Negro was a known quantity in the political arena. Those were the days when the Negro who was fortunate enough to be permitted to attend a convention dared not raise his voice in protest against anything, for fear that this coveted privilege would be withdrawn from him. Then it made no difference how pugnacious a Negro politician appeared among his people at home, he subsided into a meek, unadulterated "yes-man" when he reached the convention.

Not so today. And we rejoice at the outlook. Race consciousness has so developed that Negroes are black men primarily, and Republicans or Democrats secondarily. And they want the world to know that. Men and measures, with measures as the chief consideration. This attitude will tend to strengthen the political power of the race in America. When there are Republicans in the race with all sets of leanings, and Democrats who may jump the political fence at any time, there are men who must be converted to certain issues and whose vote must be sought as a precious thing. There is less political power. There is no power in political certainty.

Paradoxical as it may seem, much of the political strength of the Negro, which has been acquired in the last two decades, can be traced directly to the fact that he has slowly but surely, divided his vote. This change has been gradual and is the direct result of increased intellectuality and race consciousness. The Negro no longer believes that a thing is true because "the white man says so," and does not pursue his political career blindly without thought for the progress of the race as a group. Today the black American demands results from his leaders which will benefit not only one man, but the group which has sent him forth to represent it. President-day leaders, therefore, realize that to survive they must do more than get on the political bandwagon and take a pleasurable ride.

In line with this new policy, we read that certain prominent Negro Republicans are arguing that the fourteenth and fifteenth amendments should be included in a plank concerning the 18th amendment which Senator Borah proposes to put into the Republican platform. They realize even more than the average Negro, with intelligence but no particular political enthusiasm, the tremendous power of the lobby in this so-called democracy. With all power to use its franchise, the Negro American will have in his hand a weapon for which the white man has the utmost respect. With full power to vote and be elected to office, the Negro will favor to be respected, and sought for the cause of his unnumbered strength. Which is as it should be.

We do not want to be too sanguine, but a new political day seems to be dawning. We are glad of the passing of the average political of the old school. And we applaud the arrival of the fearless, aggressive, race-conscious Negro political leader, who cannot be soft-spoken in silence when the destiny and well-being of the race is at stake. Too much praise cannot be given to those who are helping to raise the political standard of the American Negro. Group progress, not personal gain, must be the watchword.

EDUCATION—A PARAMOUNT NEED

IT IS not without a significant purpose that Hon. J. A. Craigen, of the Detroit Division, and one of the High Commissioners, Williams, Secretary of the Universal Liberty University, have been designated by Hon. E. B. Knox, by and with the advice of Hon. Marcus Garvey, to make an extended visit to the local organizations for the purpose of arousing more interest and enthusiasm and greater financial support for the upkeep and discharge of necessary obligations of the University. The maintenance of an educational institution such as is designed to make Liberty University is very great and constant. The best endowed and oldest universities in the United States are constantly clamoring for more money to carry out their numerous educational plans, and it is natural that universities without endowments have a difficult problem before them all of the time. Liberty University is in this situation. It has mortgage obligations on the property to manage the several departments, and it must have a competent faculty to teach the departments, and it must have a large body of students who seldom pay as much into the school as they take out of it in expense incurred on their account.

There can be no intelligent or effective association work without a substantial basis in education of the highest and best. This is necessary in order to cope with modern forces which are making

Negro has done more in the past fifty years to enlighten mankind on the potential values in the earth, and in the waters, than heretofore had been dreamed possible. The Negro in the United States, West Indies, Latin America and in Africa who does not possess the same sort of complete education that the white race in their universities to the highest and best advantage in the results cannot hope to compete with the whites. This has been notably the case in Africa, whose priceless values have been unearthed by the high intelligence of the white man and his high development of the telegraph, telephone and railroad and steamship transportation. The Negro's lack of this education in Africa has made him the poorest of all nations, and has placed him in the position of being practically a slave in his own country without any participation whatever in the attainment of his social, civil and economic values. The vast wealth of the country is fast passing in the hands of the white man because he knows how to appreciate these values and how to use them to the best advantage, while the Negro does not.

Hampton Farmers to Meet In Conference June 18-20

HAMPTON INSTITUTE, Va. June 18.—Rural leadership of Virginia and adjacent states will assemble for the annual farmers' conference at Hampton Institute on June 18-20, according to an announcement by Director Donald Penn of the School of Agriculture, when farm demonstration agents, home demonstration agents, James supervising teachers, delegates from community groups, and men and women living in raising the levels of rural life will confer on matters vital to the farm and farming. Mr. J. B. Pierce, field agent, U. S. Department of Agriculture, and the district agents for Virginia, Miss Liza Jenkins, Mr. F. B. Patterson, and Mr. J. L. Charley, have been in co-operation with Director Penn in arrangement of the program, and one of the most successful meetings is expected at the school.

The conference this year will include emphasis on milk and milk products. Butter-making demonstrations may be participated in by both men and women attending the conference. The work in poultry husbandry will be conducted by Professor Gamack, breeder of the world's record Burred Rock hen, Hamptonian Princess, who will discuss the use of the kerosene brooder and the improvement of the farm flock. Discussion of the growing of fall and winter vegetables and diseases and pests is also a part of the scheduled work. The women's section will concern itself with home improvement, such as home conveniences and home beautification.

Director John Hutcheson of the Virginia extension service will address both the conference and the Hampton Summer School in Ogdon Hall on Tuesday, speaking on the business side of farming, while on Wednesday, A. C. Graham, subject-matter specialist, extension service, Washington, D. C., will address the same group on "The Rural Home."

The Shellbanks trip and picnic, which takes place Wednesday afternoon, is anticipated by all who in former years have attended the conference. Meetings by the men's section for the discussion of hogs, hog cholera, and the pork market, and for the women's section at the Shellbanks dormitory are parts of the program being planned on the Shellbanks lawn.
