Marvelous Love Story Of A Black Queen

OUT of the mists of three thousand years, there has come down to us this most beautiful love story of the ancient world. The story of a mighty empire attracted by the fame and wisdom of a great Jewish monarch, made a long journey to see him, and how each fell deeply in love with the other at first sight.

Here is the story as it is told in the Kebra Nagast.

The Kebra Nagast, or the Glory of Kings, is the chronicle of the Kings of Centuries of Ethiopian Kings prior to the Queen of Sheba. It dates back to the dimly remembered past, and is written in the original Ethiopic, which is the mother of our alphabet.

During the reign of Queen Victoria, an expedition under Lord Napier invaded Abyssinia, defeated the king, Theodore, and took the Kebra Nagast to England, where it was placed in the British Museum.

In 1872 while a British admiral was visiting the Kebra Nagast, he was told by the Ethiopian priest who had taken it to England, that he would like to see it. He went to the British Museum, and on the 14th of July, 1872, he saw it for the first time.

It might also be noted that the word "Sheba" is the name of a province of Abyssinia. The Shebans, or Shebanas, did not call themselves Ethiopians. That word was coined by the Greeks and meant "the Land of the Blacks, or Burnt Men."

The Shebans were descendants of Ham, son of Noah, and their empire extended from the Nile to the Indian Ocean. They were the most powerful people in the East at that time.

It is not known just how far their empire extended, but this fact is certain: the Ethiopians, as the Greeks called them, ruled in Arabia until 570 A. D.

When they were driven out by the Greeks, the Ethiopians enjoyed tremendous prestige. More than once they were masters of Egypt, and they made a treaty with the Roman Emperor, Justinian. Homer speaks of them as the wisest of men, the most distant, and the most favored of the gods.

ESSENTIAL THOUGHTS

The most beneficial exercise is that which is taken in the open air. All the body organs are then brought into play. The muscles are strengthened to carry out their intended purpose. The lungs will be better adapted for resistance. The volume will be increased to the betterment of those who desire it. It is a good tonic for a sluggish digestion. The circulation of the blood will be at its best. Exercise should not be overdone. After the age of 35 the amount of exercise should be diminished. It should not be vigorous. Those who meet vigorous exercise under a different category. Swimming is said to be the best of all exercises.

Work though pleasant it may have a tendency to exhaust both mind and body, and as every intelligent person is concerned with the span of his life there can be no better solution for the renewal of body and mind than recreation.
