

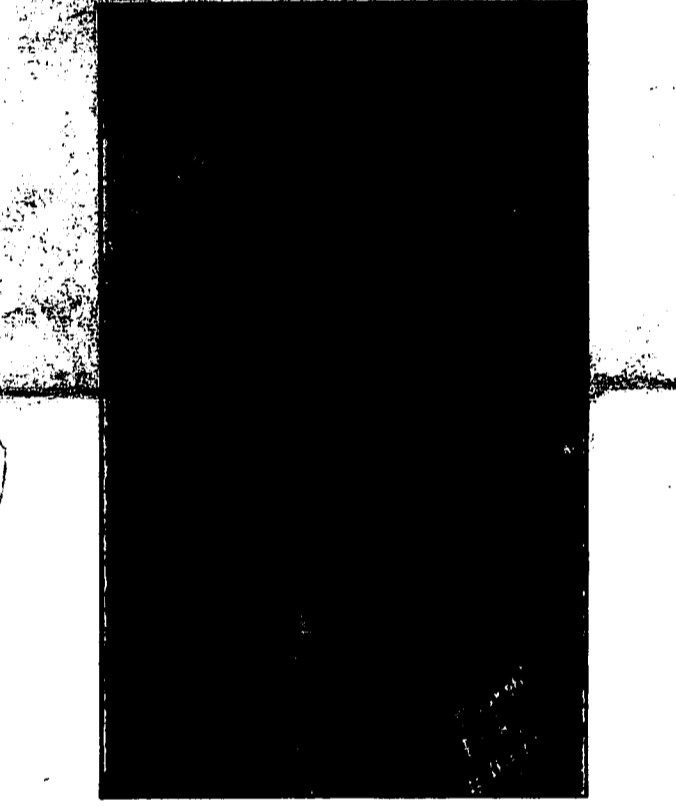

Are we ready for the battle with anything and everything that will come up to challenge our right to go forward and to conquer?

We must be prepared for triumph over every obstacle that may show itself; yes, the Negro, if he is to win the respect of the other races of men, if he is to be as himself; if he is to be able to win the approval of the Creator, must, in this period now opening with its gladness greetings, show the power of his soul, the strength of his character, the vividness of his imagination, the invincibility of his tireless will, and the unswerving determination of his decision to rise, and be reckoned with among the "lords of creation."

Looking back over the year that has passed, we see that we have not done all the things that we could have done. Let's remedy the past. Let us face the future manfully and courageously, while working heroically in the present; and let us begin to rear such monuments to the prowess and the daring of the Negro, to Negro courage and enthusiasm, to Negro energy and foresight that the present century will be marked as one of the greatest periods in the history of the human race.

This is our fondest greeting to the race of Negroes at this time. We shall work with that great ideal in mind. We shall endeavor to live up to these great expectations. We shall ever keep trying to urge, encourage, and inspire the people of the Negro race, till they have all become so quickened, so roused, so stirred up, so shaken with emotion, with ambition, and with high desire, that they will go out to write new garlands in the sky of human attainments, for the good of all mankind, and of the glory of the dusky sons of Ham. HAITI DEMANDS ATTENTION

STORIES are being told of the unhappy land full of the frightful state of affairs in Haiti under American marine rule. Reports from apparently confidential sources say that hundreds of defenseless people were shot down in cold blood, because they dared to voice their feelings, as to the continuing in office of one whom they regard as an impostor, foisted upon them, against their will, and only kept in power, because of the fear of the bayonets of the U. S. marines. We cannot say whether these reports are absolutely true, or whether they are overdrawn, but one thing we do know is, that there is a deplorable situation in Haiti, aggravated by the rough-shod rule of the American marines; and that because of this something ought to be done; and done quick. The civilized world waits with bated breath the action that will be taken by the United States government in this present crisis, for a crisis it is indeed.

President Hoover expressed his desire to do the right thing. We sincerely hope that he will speed up the commission and the whole investigation, so that the truth may be quickly arrived at and the remedy applied. We are here expressing the hope that the same efficiency which has marked his successful private life, may be carried into his administration as President of the United States of America, and that that efficiency will be tempered by the peace and justice he so much loves to talk about.
