# GARVEY FORGIVES IGNORANT FOES

## Finds Them in the Present Crisis As Helpless As the Leaderless People; Extends to Them His Sympathy

### To Put Race Above Self-Seekers and Forgive the Latter for Their Lack of Vision and Patriotism

Fellowmen of the Negro Race, Greeting:

The extraordinary world economic crisis is exacting a terrible toll of suffering from the unprepared individual, peoples and nations who had not vision enough to realize that following the years of plenty would come lean years, such as we have been told of in the story of Egypt during the days of Joseph.

### Where There Is No Vision

It is said somewhere: "Where there is no vision the people perish." For many years we of the Universal Negro Improvement Association have preached among the Negro peoples of the world the doctrine of preparedness; in doing that we were buffeted and kicked, and scorned by many of the wisecracks who today find themselves, along with the unprepared peoples, in a state of economic bankruptcy.

### Price to Learn and Understand

It is a pity that as a race we have to pay such a price to learn and understand; but when the worst is said and done, those of us who are in earnest to lead, must extend that sympathy that is necessary even though those to whom we may extend it might at some time or other have been our fiercest foes. As a race we are linked together in one common destiny and so we cannot allow any section or unit to suffer because of ignorance or selfishness.

### Another Warning

We are again sending the warning to Negroes everywhere, especially those of the United States, South and Central America, the West Indies and Africa, that the next ten years must either make or unmake the race in that we are on our last legs, unprepared and entering into a new era.
