If He Stays a Slave He Will Most Certainly Commit Race Suicide

Fellow-Men of the Negro Race, Greeting: The Negro stands at the cross-roads of human destiny. He is at the place where he must either step forward or backward.

We are on the way either to a higher racial existence or racial extermination. This much is known and realized by every thoughtful race and nation; hence, we have the death struggle of the different races of Europe and Asia in the scramble for the survival of the fittest race.

Weaker Races Will Be Eliminated

The world today is not growing larger, but the human race is multiplying year by year, decade by decade, century by century. Where we once had two people to occupy the world, and they have multiplied into 1,700,000,000, it is expected that in another 500 years these 1,700,000,000 will have multiplied into about three or four billions.

When the Colonists of America desired possession of the land, they saw that a weak aboriginal race was in their way. What did they do? They got hold of them, killed them, and buried them underground.

Shallow-Minded a Stumbling Block

The illiterate and shallow-minded Negro who can see no farther than his nose is now the greatest stumbling-block in the way of the race. He tells us that we must be satisfied with our condition; that we must not think of building up a nation of our own; that we must not seek to organize ourselves racially, but that we must depend upon the good feeling of the other fellow for the solution of the problem that now confronts us.

RICHMOND.—More interest is being manifested in politics here on the part of colored citizens than has been the case in many years. Organized efforts of citizens, ministers, political and civic organizations, the press, and churches, the number of qualified voters has increased from 1,500 at the beginning of 1931 to 2,300 at the present time.

Britain Bars Congress Convention in India

NEW DELHI.—The Government of India has banned a convention of the Nationalist Congress planned for April 24 because the civil disobedience movement is still in progress.

Date Fixed for Ending Nicaraguan Army Aid

WASHINGTON.—Next Jan. 2 has been fixed for handing over complete control of the Nicaraguan National Guard to Nicaraguan command. A State Department announcement today indicated that after that date plans would be followed to withdraw all American forces from Nicaraguan soil.

Raid on 2,500 South Africans

NATAL, South Africa.—Over 2,500 Kaffirs, natives of Natal, were haled before ten magistrates here recently and fined two English pounds (about \$9) each, as result of a wholesale raid upon the native section of the city. The cause of the raid was said to be the refusal of the Kaffirs, an independent race of people, to give up rights of citizenship conferred on them in 1856 when Natal was made a Crown Colony and incorporated into the Union of South Africa.

For years the English and Boers in South Africa have held the native population in most of the colonies in a state of peonage. In Rhodesia, a native must work, or be arrested. He cannot leave the diamond mines or the plantation without a pass from his employer and is restricted in other ways by high taxes and regulations. In Natal, however, a native is entitled to a greater degree of freedom than elsewhere in the Union of South Africa.

The recent wholesale arrests mark another such attempt. The individual fines are considered large in the colony, where coin of the realm is at a premium. In most instances the natives will be forced to pay themselves out at forced labor to pay these fines.

WASHINGTON.—Calling upon the members of Congress to make some gesture of support toward the more than 100,000 ex-slaves above the age of 75 years who now live in the United States, as partial expiation for the sin of working their forbears during 244 years without compensation, Congressman Oscar DePriest placed his bill for the pensioning of former slaves before the house of representatives Saturday, March 19, in what constituted the longest speech he has made during his two terms in Congress.
