## C. M. A. Stock Is 90% Subscribed

In a letter to the stockholders of the organization last week, C. M. A. Stock is 90% subscribed. It was gratified to say that the \$100,000 capital stock is more than 90 per cent subscribed. Mr. Halsey's letter read, "Our organization was capitalized for \$100,000, and the stock issued in now more than 90 per cent subscribed. ## CRASH THROUGH SOUTHERN PREJUDICE

LAST week we commented favorably upon the sentiment expressed by Justice Cardozo in the Texas primary case in which he emphasized the duty of the Supreme Court to "level by its judgments these barriers of prejudice." But at the same time we said that the decision had left loopholes on which we promised further study. And here we are.

The Negro press, it seems to us, has been exulting and too prematurely on the "success" achieved in the Texas primary case. The tendency has been either to pat their own back or the back of the organization that furnished the legal talent to fight this case. But the latter attitude will show Mr. Cardozo's opinion has not only left too many loopholes but has offered concrete suggestions as to how best eliminate the Negro from the primaries without violating the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Amendments. We draw our readers' attention to the following passage:

"Whatever our conclusions might be if the statute had remained unamended, the qualifications of its members, nothing of the kind was done. Instead, the statute lodged the power in a committee, which elected the petitioner and others of his race, not by virtue of any authority delegated by the party, but by virtue of an authority originating or supposed to originate in the mandate of the law." (Italics ours.)

You will notice in the above passage the words "supposed to originate" in the majority opinion voids the ban on the Negro not because they were opposed to discrimination but because it was authorized by the mandate of the law. It seems to be the opinion of these judges that if the Democratic party had attempted to confide authority to determine of its own motion the requisites of party membership and in so doing to speak for the party as a whole. Never has the State constitution made declaration of a will to bar Negroes of the party rights." (Italics ours.)

Such a way out suggested by the eminent and liberal authorities of the Supreme Court certainly will be followed by all those forces in the South that are clamoring to exclude the Negro from politics. If the Democratic party as such were to ban the Negro from its ranks and primaries the Negro will find it hard to win his case even in the Supreme Court. The defense of discrimination in the future will follow the lines of the minority opinion rendered by Justice McReynolds in which he
